# **15 Month Well Visit**

What your baby may be doing now:

- Walking, climbing stairs
- Saying 3-5 words,
- understand simple commands
- Pointing to body parts
- Pointing with fingers to indicate wants
- Imitating activities

Feeding:

- Encourage your child to drink from a cup. Bottles and pacifiers should no longer be used at this age
- Offer your child whole milk, Between 16 and 24 ounces daily
- Feed your child 3 meals daily plus at least 2 snacks
- Offer a variety of healthy foods every day- your child will decide how much to eat. Picky eating in toddlers is normal, and your child will have "good days" and "bad days."
- If you do not use fluoridated water, your child may need a fluoride supplement.

#### Parenting:

- Brush teeth with a soft toothbrush every day.
- Say "no" to your child when necessary, and remove him from the dangerous situation. Avoid yelling or spanking.
- If your child has a tantrum, try to ignore it, or distract her with something else.
- Limit choices to two things to help limit tantrum behavior
- Praise good behaviors and ignore unwanted behaviors
- Read books to your child.

#### Safety

- Use a rear facing car seat for every ride until at least 2 years old and 30 pounds
- Put gates on top and bottom of stairs

- Prevent drowning-supervise your child at all times when near water
- Use sun block with SPF of at least 30 whenever you are out.
- Prevent choking- keep small objects and toys out of your child's reach.
- Childproof your home- cover outlets; install latches on cabinets; keep cleaning products out of reach,
- Lower the water heater temperature in your home to 120°F or less, to prevent accidental burns
- Remember the Poison Control Number handy: 1-800-Poison-1

### When to call the office:

- If your child has vomiting and diarrhea for more than a day, is acting very sluggish or irritable, has trouble breathing, has a fever over 102°F, or if you have other concerns.

Vaccines/Tests at this visit:

- Varicella
- Flu (in season)
- PNP Vaccine policy

Your child may have a mild fever or fussiness after his vaccines today. You may use Tylenol every 4-6 hrs as needed.
